



But they are only permitted to elect from among the twenty-four sons of the late king, and entrust the affairs of the country to his care for terms lasting two years. These princes, whose names each contain the prefix "Demo" (their grandfather's name), rule over their country one-by-one — feasting, pillaging and plundering the country as much as possible, lining their pockets with enough cash to live out their days in luxury. The princes see themselves with a one in twenty-four chance of being re-elected because they know that the people have no other choice than to choose one from among them. But as the behavior of the people is always unpredictable, none of the twenty-four princes are elected to a second term. The people vote for the twenty-fifth brother who had never previously been considered as a serious candidate for election. This prince who suffers from physical, mental and emotional defects and shortages is known among the people by the nickname they gave him, Demo Crazy. He wins the election and rises to power against all odds and predictions of the other princes and even of the people who had voted for him. The behavior and documented speeches of Demo Crazy are really astonishing, and even more unusual are the laws and regulations he exercised in ruling over the country. The question of whether or not the standard and conventional democracy in the world today is predicated upon the principles and methods that Demo Crazy carried out in this book is presented only as food for thought and not as a steadfast claim. The judgment and decision on this issue will be left to the reader.


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# AN EASTERN DREAM







Rumi was and is revered by his disciples even to this day, but where and how did his journey from His Holiness the beloved cleric to Rumi the ground-breaking mystic begin? Saeedeh Qods, author and philanthropist, says that she grew up listening to her mother recite Rumi's poetry at bedtime. Later, she went on to carry out extensive research about Rumi in Iran and the neighbouring countries to satisfy her curiosity about the man. Her investigation reveals the unbelievable tale of how Rumi lived and what life was like for those closest to him; we are treated to a vivid account of a man whose words mystified and mesmerised believers the world over. This novel helps us to understand how reputations can be built. Rumi was born and lived his early life in a village in the province of Balkh, now Tajikistan, which came under the cultural sphere of Iran and was an area once governed by the Eastern Roman Empire. Rumi's father, Baha ud'Din Walad, decided to take his family west to avoid the impending Mongol invasion and they eventually settled in the Anatolian city Konya, in present-day Turkey. This is where Rumi was to have a profound influence on the culture of the region; he composed one of the most important oeuvres in Persian literature in Konya and it is where the story begins. Qods opens a porthole on life in the harem of His Holiness, a place that is quite unexpected. Unlike a typical harem, His Holiness kept only one wife but she is surrounded by a host of female relatives, of all ages, whose well-being he is responsible for. Kimya's vividly woven tale enables us to become familiar with the interactions between the women that live in the harem, from the perspective of a bewildered adolescent. The harem was like a mini-citadel which was home to women of many ages, whose well-being required their interdependence and whose mood was often dictated by the demeanour of His Holiness. This insular world brought a great deal of melancholy to His Holiness although it is unclear whether it was the tradition of the harem that brought this about or whether it was connected to the obligations he felt towards the wider community of the city itself. This is a manifold tale oflove and adolescence which embraces the age of innocence and shows us the ultimate personal sacrifice. The author immerses herself in the character of her heroine, Kimya and begins to experience all that she felt growing up in the harem of one of the most notable men of the time in that region. We are introduced to all her thoughts as she succumbs to the restrictions in a house where trips to the hammam become the highlight of her life; a life where occasional, covert trips to the rooftop fan excitement because they are the only times when she can glimpse the world outside her home full of women

# **Author About:**

Saideh Ghods, author and philanthropist, says that she grew up listening to her mother recite Rumi s poetry at bedtime. Ali Esfandyari (1897-1960), who later on chose "Nima Youshij" as his pen name, was born in Yoush, a village in Mazandaran, Iran. He learnt reading and writing from a Mullah who lived there. However, at the age of twelve, he moved to Tehran and was enrolled at St. Louis High School. At school, due to the care and encouragement of a teacher called Nezam Vafa, he set foot in the realm of poetry. At first, sometimes, and later, more often, he wrote poems with rhythms different from the customary ones in Persian poetry. The literary figures regarded these types of poems sometimes with admiration and approval, sometimes with ridicule and even with anger. The nature of his birthplace, the objects and the language of the people there made strong lights and shades in Nima's poetry. Nima Youshij is considered the father of modern Persian poetry. As a result of his innovations in the realm of rhythm, rhyme and meter, the poets can now break free from limitations of traditional verse form and transfer what they intend to express in accordance with the mood and the atmosphere. He died in Tehran and was buried in his village, Yoush, as he had willed.

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

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

We behold the purple mountains and wide, verdant countryside, feel the arid wind blowing, the colorful seasons changing, and hear a babbling, rocky brook flowing underneath a canopy of sycamore trees. Houshang Moradi Kermani masterfully depicts everything lovable about Iran and its people in this story. There are aspects of life we can all feel which go beyond nationality or geographic definition. In one word, his characters are real and we get to know them very well. Hearing their inner voices, we come to understand them and can relate to them. Witnessing their interaction with various members of their village at a time when every person's role and duty was defined strictly by custom and tradition, we empathize with their problems and dilemmas. By the end of the story, we feel one with these people and applaud their successes and victories alongside them. Iranians are dearly devoted to their poets and often use poetry in their everyday language, which is full of imagery and metaphor. This mindset of vivid imagination is reflected in the way the characters in the story often saw the water urn as bearing human qualities in one way or another. The creative thought that Houshang Moradi Kermani attributes to his characters in the story is congruous with the inspired legacy the great masters of Persian poetry left to the Iranian culture. While immersed in this story, this very Persian element of metaphoric expression kept reminding me of Omar Khayyam's metaphor of the clay vessel, a theme found in many of his quatrains. Khayyam saw the clay from which urns were made as originating from the dust which once had been a human being. I was reminded of this poem by Khayyam, which I will translate for you here:



While at first glance The Veil of Tears appears to be a tragic soap opera, closer inspection reveals a book which provides a glimpse to how the culture and laws of a country, in this case Iran, impact on the lives of the men and women in that nation state. The two murders, which take place during the course of this story, bring these issues into sharp focus. The narrative exposes the path that the majority of young people still travel down in their journey towards marriage; its poignancy lies in its enduring legitimacy in the 20th century. Amongst the humour, interwoven throughout the fabric of the text, the reader will find an astonishing depth to family ties and a familial closeness that clearly has far-reaching consequences. In this culture, members of both the immediate and extended family will stop at nothing in their efforts to help each other; we learn that troubled marriages can often be saved by the intervention of elders. As the story unfolds, one begins to appreciate the intensity of affection and profound sense of responsibility that is innate in a mother s love, something which highlights the huge sacrifices that she is prepared to make for her children. Turning eighteen became as delicious and as pleasurable as approaching Eftar when the Muslims break their fast after sunset during Ramadan. I had honoured the ritual of fasting over the years but now, as I stood on the threshold of my eighteenth year, I looked forward to a future where I could finally taste what had previously been forbidden to me.





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
